I have noticed that despite the Fair Political Practices Commission's (FPPC) letter to you on July 1, 2008, stating in no uncertain terms that your complaint accusing me of taking illegal contributions from contractors doing business with the Metropolitan Transportation Authority is baseless, you continue to promote these statements electronically, verbally and in writing.


As General Counsel Scott Hallabrin of the FPPC wrote to you, "The information you provided is insufficient to establish a violation of the Act (Political Reform Act). Campaign contributions are not an economic interest under Section 87103(c) and would not pose a conflict of interest for an elected official."

According to law, anyone found to be responsible for a defamatory statement that is published or communicated to at least one other person besides the plaintiff can be found guilty of libel or slander depending on whether the statement was written or spoken.

The fact that by way of Hallabrin's letter, you apparently knew your statements were false but yet in still continued to disseminate them seems to make you ripe for litigation. Additionally, your long history of harassing both me and my office shows malice which would also strengthen my argument.

That being said, I am formally requesting you to cease and desist with the spreading of these erroneous statements to prevent likely legal action.
